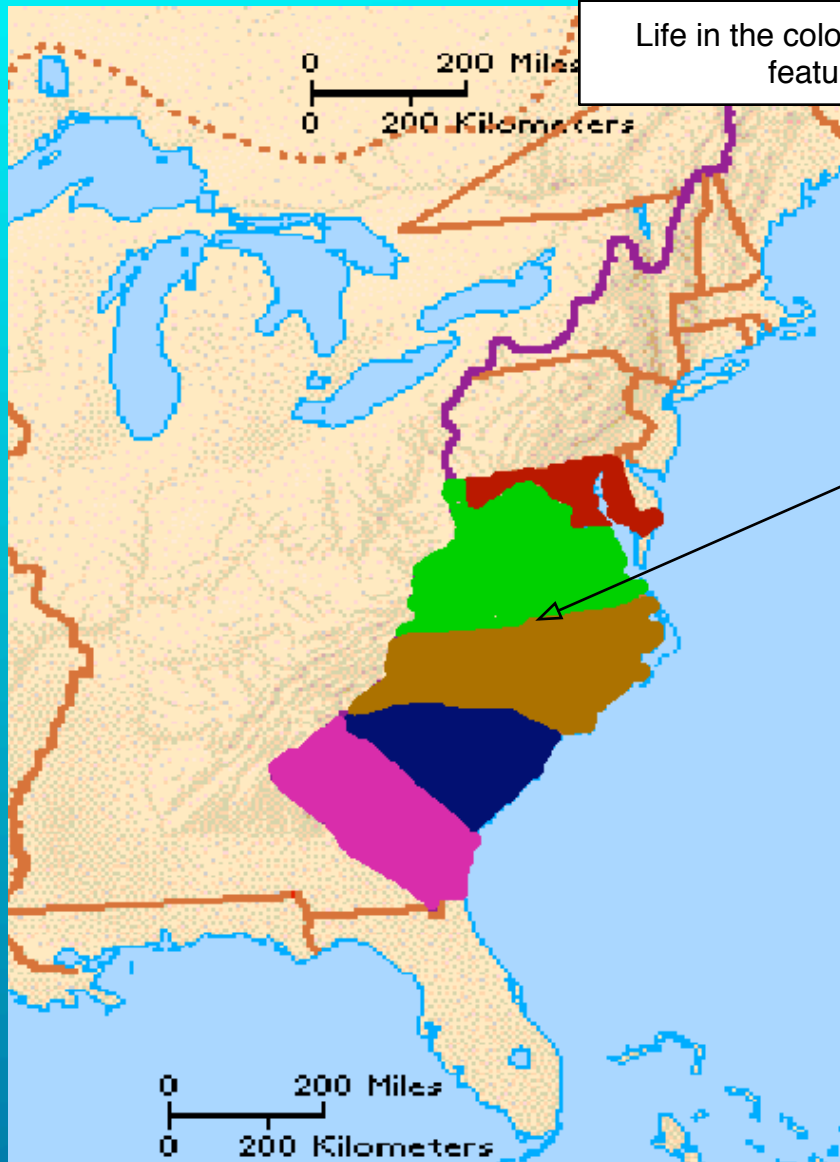

Geography and climate

Appalachian Mountains, Piedmont, Atlantic Coastal Plain, good harbors, rivers and humid climate

Economy

Large farms/plantations, cash crops, wood products, small farms and slavery

Social life

Plantations (slavery), mansions, indentured servants, few cities and few schools

Political and civic life

Counties
