England's reasons for control of the American colonies

England desired to remain a world power.

England imposed taxes, such as the Stamp Act, to raise necessary revenue to pay the cost of the French and Indian war.

England's reasons for taxation of the American colonies

England needed help to pay for the French and Indian War.

England needed help to maintain troops in the colonies.

Sources of colonial dissatisfaction with England's rule

Colonies had no representation in Parliament.

Some colonists resented the colonial governor's power.

Resentment over England's desire to strictly control colonial legislatures.

Colonial opposition to taxation.

The Proclamation of 1763 hampered the westward movement of settlers.
